

Emergency Medicine Faculty Physicians

The **BerbeeWalsh Department of Emergency Medicine** invites applications for **board-certified/eligible emergency medicine physicians** to join a thriving cohort of nearly 50 academic and clinical faculty at the University of Wisconsin School of Medicine and Public Health.

General emergency medicine faculty and faculty with expertise in the following areas are encouraged to apply:

- General Faculty
- Research Faculty (CHS or tenure track)
- Global Emergency Medicine Faculty
- Patient Safety and Quality-Focused Faculty
- Flight Physicians (part-time and moonlighting)

Applicants must have obtained an M.D. or D.O. degree and have graduated from an accredited emergency medicine residency program. Candidates should have strong interpersonal skills and the ability to work cooperatively with all sections of the school, hospital and department.

Clinical Responsibilities

This position will deliver exceptional patient-centered emergency care as part of an operationally efficient health system at UW Health, the integrated health system of the University of Wisconsin–Madison. Our flagship emergency department at University Hospital is a busy referral hospital—one of only two academic medical centers in the state — a Level 1 Trauma and Burn Center for both adult and pediatric patients, and an ELSO Gold-Certified Center ranked the #1 hospital in Wisconsin by U.S. News & World Report for the last 11 years in a row.

Approximately >90 percent of the patient market is insured, and therefore lower-acuity patients have robust urgent care centers as alternative options to the ED. At the University Hospital ED, Emergency Severity Index 1, 2, and 3 patients dominate patient visits. The admission rate exceeds 30 percent at this site. Faculty may also staff our community ED at East Madison Hospital, a 16-bed clinical setting that cares for 20,000 adult and pediatric patients annually.

Academic & Teaching Responsibilities

Appointment to the academic CHS track will include significant clinical and didactic teaching responsibilities for medical students, residents (emergency medicine and off-service) and fellows. The successful applicant will participate in administrative and committee work to support the clinical and scholarly missions of UW Health and the School of Medicine and Public Health (UW SMPH). Distribution of effort in the section and the Department will be determined in accordance with service needs, academic priorities and the candidate's expertise and academic goals.

Tenure Track

A successful candidate must have a documented track record of academic productivity or have demonstrated potential to develop an independent research program in a clinically orientated research field relevant to emergency medicine. Tenure track faculty are expected to participate in clinical and didactic teaching of students, residents and fellows; participate in continuing education programs; and be involved in committees at the Department, School, and/or professional level.

About the Department of Emergency Medicine

Since our founding in 2014, the Department of Emergency Medicine has become a top tier academic department of emergency medicine, now with seven subspecialty divisions and around 50 academic faculty, over 20 advanced practice providers, and more than 30 research and administrative staff members.

We strive to advance our specialty and to improve the health and wellbeing of patients within the communities we serve through exceptional leadership in clinical care, medical education, research, advocacy and community engagement. To this



end, we are deeply committed to identifying and addressing structural barriers to health and health equity and to fostering diversity, equity and inclusion in all aspects of our work.

Through state-of-the-art clinical facilities and services — including UW Health Med Flight, the only air medical service in the United States fully staffed by attending physicians — and robust clinical programs such as EMS, critical care and ultrasound, we deliver high-quality care to patients from across the upper Midwest. We also engage communities and health systems abroad through global emergency medicine initiatives.

Training the next generation of emergency physicians and clinician-scientists is integral to our mission, with more than 45 residents and fellows being trained each year in our three-year, ACGME-accredited emergency medicine residency and 8 specialty fellowship training programs. Our research enterprise also enhances and facilitates high-impact clinical and translational emergency care research and fosters the successful development of investigators dedicated to generating new knowledge and advancing equitable health care.

Extensive opportunities for collaborative research exist within the UW SMPH and the UW-Madison campus. And with active programs in basic, clinical and public health science, the UW SMPH has a tradition of pioneering research, receiving \$439 million in research funding in 2019-20. It has also consistently ranked among U.S. News and World Report's best medical schools for primary care and research. Grants obtained by SMPH faculty constituted 41% of total grants to UW–Madison during 2019-20.
